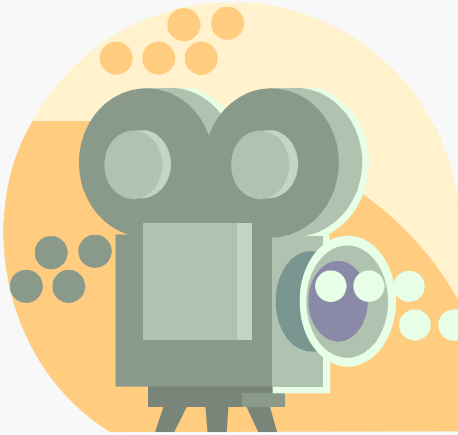

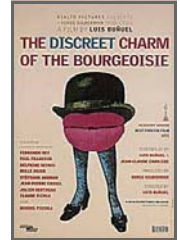

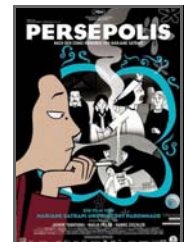
**Thursday, February 9 6:30pm**

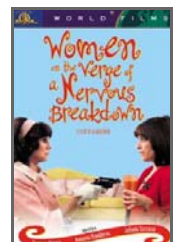

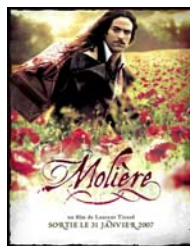
